Clothing and Diaper Closet: Families have access to new and gently-used clothing as well as diapers and wipes.

Food Bank: Family Tree has a food bank for families participating in our programs, to assist them with any food insecurity issues they may face.

Transportation: Gas vouchers for parents participating in our programs are provided when available. Transportation via one of our Family Tree buses may also be available.

Recovery Support: Peer mentors help parents in recovery maintain their sobriety through helping access meetings, treatment, and other support as needed.


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What is Family Tree Relief Nursery?

We are trained professionals and volunteers committed to partnering with families to keep children safe and build stable families.

What does the Relief Nursery do for you?

- We help low-income families with children under six years of age.
- We can help provide respite to parents so they can get things done and take better care of themselves and their children
- We provide support services for parents who are facing multiple stressors in their lives.
- We help young children get what they need to grow and learn.
- We help parents find safe and effective ways to communicate with and discipline their children.
- We help parents understand what to expect from their children at different ages.
- We help parents find and connect with community resources.

Therapeutic Classrooms

Our early childhood center-based programs serve children from 2 to 5 years of age in a therapeutic classroom two mornings each week. The children have a snack and lunch, supported playtime, group experiences and outside or gym activities. This is a specialized classroom environment emphasizing social and emotional development.

In the home-based program, children & their parents receive similar services but the classroom experience is less often, anywhere from two to four times each month. The classroom programs also include one home visit a month.

Home Visits

Teachers from both the center and home-based programs meet with families in their homes once each month. They bring activities and ideas to help parents teach and guide their child. This is also a time for parents and teachers to address any concerns, ask questions, and to share information.

Parent Education

We provide regular parenting classes which give participants the opportunity to connect with other parents. The classes are taught in both Spanish and English and are designed to share information and facilitate problem solving with support from peers.
